

## IMPORT BEERS

### BELGIAN \$4.25

- *Stella Artois*: Premium lager beer.

### BELGIAN \$5.50

- *Pauwell Kwak Belgium Ale*: A warming, garnet-colored ale. Named after a famous innkeeper who used to serve beer in stirrup cups to horseman for drinking in the saddle.
- *Wittekerke Authentic Belgian Wheat Ale*: From regional brewing in Bavikove in West Flanders, Bavik.

### BELGIAN \$6.50

- *Orval Trappist Ale*: (Orval means “Vale of Gold”) Belgian classic, only brew made by Abbaye d’Orval. Orange with heady, hoppy aroma and intense dry flavor.
- *Duval Belgian Ale*: One of the best known and celebrated drinks in Belgium. Golden ale with frothy white top. Heady hot aroma with complex fruity flavor.
- *Piraat Blonde Beer*: Light colored with a perfect matching of malt, hops, and yeast: and a 10.5% alcohol, it’s a real knockout.

### BELGIAN \$7.50

- *Lindemans Framboise Lambic*: Spontaneously fermented beer flavored with natural juice of raspberries and matured in an Oak cask.
- *Lindemans Kriek Lambic*: Spontaneously fermented beer flavored with natural juice of cherries and matured in an Oak cask.

### BELGIAN \$14.00

- *Tripel Karmeliet Authentic Belgian Ale*: Blond, robust, smooth and fruity bottle-conditioned ale. Brewed by the Bosteels Family Brewers since 1791. Enough to share!

### IRISH \$4.25

- *Murphy’s Irish Red Ale*: Distinctive red hue is entirely natural.
- *Harp Lager*: Golden lager launched in 1960 to mark the bicentennial of Guinness.

### IRISH \$4.50

- *Murphy’s Irish Stout*: Relatively light, smooth stout.

### ENGLISH \$4.50

- *Boddington’s Pub Ale*: A unique, pale-golden ale first brewed in 1778.
- *Banana Bread Beer*: Dark, golden colored ale. Tropically fruity, ripe banana flavor emphasized by a hint of bitterness.

### ENGLISH \$6.50

- *Hen’s Tooth*: Bottle conditioned ale. A very unique flavor. A deep gold premium pale ale with a good malt and hop balance.
- *Young’s Double Chocolate Stout*: Chocolate malt and real dark chocolate combined with rich full-flavored dark beer. Satisfyingly indulgent, but never overly sweet
- *Samuel Smith Nut Brown Ale*: Nutty sweet flavor.

- *Weinhester-Original Premium Lager*

- *Pilsner Urquell* – Czech Republic
- *Corona* – Mexico: “La Cerveza mas fina.”
- *Tilburg’s Dutch Brown Ale* - Netherlands: Highly fermented ale.
- *Amstel Lite* - Netherlands: A premium lager.

**VARIETY IMPORT \$5.50**

- *Stiegl Lemon Radler* – Austria: 50% Lemon Soda & 50% Beer (Pilsner).
- *Stiegl* – Austria: A golden pilsner with a hoppy, aromatic flavor.

- *Belhaven Twisted Thistle I.P.A.* – Scotland: A very peat-flavored ale.
